THINGS TO DO IN SILVER SPRING AND DC

THINGS TO DO

Downtown Silver Spring

Busy pedestrian shopping center with a kid-friendly fountain, movie theaters, restaurants & occasional live music. Shops include Loft, Ulta, New York & Company, DSW Shoes, H&M, and more!

Smithsonian Museums

Some of the most popular museums in DC include the Natural History Museum, American History Museum, and the Portrait Gallery. There are 19 world-class museums with over 154 MILLION artifacts. All are free and easily accessible via Metro.

Washington Nationals Baseball

The Washington Nationals play at Nationals Park throughout the summer and fall. Tickets generally start at \$11.

Washington Wizards Basketball

The Wizards play at the Capital One Arena throughout the fall and winter. Tickets generally start at \$20.

National Zoo

Always free of charge and open 364 days a year, the Smithsonian's National Zoo is part of the Smithsonian Institution, the world's largest museum and research complex. Founded in 1889, the Zoo sits on 163 acres in the heart of Washington, D.C.'s Rock Creek Park and is home to more than 1,500 animals across 300 different species.

National Mall

Not for shopping, the long, grassy National Mall is home to iconic monuments including the Lincoln Memorial and the Washington Monument. At the eastern end is the domed U.S. Capitol, and the White House is to the north. It's also flanked by Smithsonian museums and easily accessible via Metro.

<u>Georgetown</u>

Georgetown is a charming historic neighborhood with Federal-style architecture, cobblestone streets and fashion and design shops. The dining scene is defined by upmarket restaurants and waterfront seafood spots, while nightlife spans boisterous college bars, traditional taverns and intimate live music lounges. Georgetown Waterfront Park has a riverside promenade and gardens, and there's a bike path along the C&O Canal.

Rock Creek Park

There are over 32 miles of trails in Rock Creek Park. An oasis of green in busy Washington, DC, Rock Creek Park is an expansive natural oasis in the middle of the city preserving the Rock Creek Valley. The oldest standing structure in DC, The Old Stone House, was built here in 1765.

City Center DC

Located in the heart of the district, there's a lot to discover at CityCenterDC. This large, modern shopping center is packed with high-end retailers and sophisticated restaurants.

GETTING AROUND

Metro

Metro is the public transit system throughout DC and surrounding counties in Maryland and Virginia. The nearest rail station is only a few blocks from the APHL office. Take the Red Line train toward Shady Grove and you can get just about anywhere downtown! Heading to the National Mall? Transfer at Metro Center and take a Blue, Silver, or Orange Line train to Smithsonian Station. Trip fare is between \$3-4 each way. Purchase fare cards at any station.

Uber/Lyft

Whether you're headed downtown or to the airport, these rideshare apps connect you with a ride in minutes. One tap and a car comes directly to you.
